INTRODUCTION

A Study Tour from 29:11 2022 to 7:12 2022 with 35 students was organised by the Government Mizoram Law College. The students of 5th semester LLB undertook study tour for 9 days. It was the occasion for the college to organise study tour to Supreme Court, on request of the students as they could not go for any study tour in the last two years due to pandemic. We were all exposed to various educational institutions, parliament, High Court of Delhi, Supreme Court of India. The students were also given a chance to visit in which the famous places in Delhi, Taj Mahal, Qutab Minar, Red Fort, Lotus Temple, India Gate through this tour the student gain lot of experience in various aspect of group living. The student were also exposed to new environment and acquired some knowledge about the legal thought and also a vast exposure to the discipline of court procedure. The students enjoyed this tour a lot and due to prior planning and its proper execution. The students were divided into six groups.

DAY=1 (29.11.2022)



First, we arrived at the college and departed by the college Bus from there by 7:00am, after being briefed and prayers by Miss Rebecca Lalrindiki who is the tour incharge from the faculty. We reached Lengpui Airport at 8:45am and after checking in we departed at 11:30am by Indigo flight. We reached Kolkata Airport at 12:30pm, and had lunch

while waiting for our next flight. We departed from Kolkata at 3:00pm and reached Delhi Airport at 5:30pm. After claiming our baggages, we left for Vasant Vihar Mizoram House by Bus and reached our destination by around 7:30pm.

DAY - 2 (30.11.2022) INDIAN LAW INSTITUTE (ILI)

The first day and first visit for the tour is the Indian Law Institute and left at 9:15am by Bus. We were all excited and received a warm welcome when we reached. We had interaction with Dr. Jyoti Dogra Sood one of their professor.

Beside talking about their college, she also told us about Delhi Supreme Court and many other things about law that we were not aware of. She answered our questions and then gave us a tour of their library which contains several good and educative books. It was beneficial and we wished that our college has one like that too.



The Indian Law Institute is which is a deemed university and socio legal institute founded in 1956. The institute is an autonomous body registered under the societies Registration Act,1860,The Indian Law Institute has the requisite independence and academic freedom to carry out its objective.The membership of the institute is now nearly three thousand representing the persons interested in the study and advancement of Law

As we don't have much time, we soon departed for the parliament by the same bus. It was quite difficult to get inside the parliament.As mobile phones and bags were not allowed inside the parliament we could only enter after security check in with the help of our MP Pu PC Lalrosanga, Being inside the



Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha that we use to learn since childhood is amazing, our guide told us the meaning of the different galleries it was very informative and enlightening us, the purpose of the visit of parliament was to make student understand the working of Lok Saha and Rajya Sabha. It was fascinating for the student to see all the proceedings live which we normally see on T.V. The elected members followed the formal protocol, another fascinating feature is the headphone facilities whereby any member can switch to the language in which want to hear the proceedings. Even some live interpreter are available there, inside the Parliament there are many galleries on the first floor of the house, above the hall where the member sit. Apart from the public gallery meant for the general public, there are five other galleries press galleries is obviously meant for media personnel. Distinguished visitors gallery meant for legislative members, spouses of the parliament members and other distinguished public figure. Lok Sabha member gallery is for the member of the lower house to witness the proceedings of the upper house. The official gallery is for the government officials who need to participate in the house

Both the houses are a bit different and everything present there has its own reason as in the Lok Sabha the carpet was of green colour and in Rajya Sabha is of Red colour. Apart from visiting the parliament, the students got a chance to visited central hall of Parliament and it was the centre of three halls and where the British had finally handed over the control of the country back in 1974 marking the historic moment for the freedom of the country.

The experience of the visit was a memorable time not just for witnessing its adorned architecture but also by learning more about the Indian law and working of the legislature proceedings. An actual experience of the parliamentary procedures and the role of speaker of the Lok Sabha which the student had studied in the text books made it truly memorable

After having lunch we visited the High Court of Delhi the students were accompanied by one of the advocate in high court, the visit started with a brief note given to the student about the court and court rooms by Advocate Mr Shekhar who is practicing advocate at High court of Delhi. He guided all the students and dedicated the jurisdiction of the different courts. The students obtained valuable



knowledge by Mr Prakash Singh Legal Service Authority, he explained court proceedings in detail and suggested students to read a Bare Acts and attend regular class lectures. The students visited different court rooms.

The students also visited various chambers and the visit came to an end at 5:50pm with a thank giving note to Mr Prakash Singh

Legal Service Authority and Advocate Mr Shekhar for enlightening the students with such facts which brought out the difference in the proceedings between the District court and High Court as well as where the students asked him various question and got prompt answer from him, the visit came to an end at 4:45pm and team was back at the house at 6:30pm after dinner in the House itself all were sent to their respective rooms.

DAY 3 (1.12.2022)

AGRA TOUR

Our day began with an early departure from the Mizoram house at 5:00am, we all climbed up into the bus for a quick hop to the Taj Mahal. Unfortunately, our bus broke down on the way and we are delayed for more than three hours,

We reached Taj Mahal at 4:30pm where we boarded an open card to scan to take us to the front gate, they divided gender lines to go through security, we took photos as a group and individually, before we reach the main building of the taj we walk on a path which has tall attractive cypress tress on either side, had an amazing time in Agra, which became an excellent experience to visit, we had such great expectation from the monument, also we had a luck with weather, so we were able able to see Taj Mahal clearly, as everybody know this symbol of love of a king for his wife who was not alive.



We went down staircase, we found the graves of the king and the queen under the dome in a dark chamber, multicoloured pieces of glass and couplets from the Quran decorated the side walls. The four minarets stood as watch men at each of the main building, and luckily we meet

Sashi Tharoor who is an Indian former international civil servant, Bureaucrats and politician, who has been serving as Member of Parliament for Thiruvunanthapuram Kerala, and we are very happy to see



him and took a picture with him, it was very encouraging to see how candid they were to us. we spend several hours and took hundred of photos.

After spending more than one hours adoring the site clicking pictures and enjoying views, we enjoyed the trip to the taj mahal very much, it was really an unforgettable experience which apart from being intellectually rewarding gave us a glimpse of our country's proud history, we took a leave from the place at 6:00pm and get back to our house (Mizoram house) and we reached at 1:30am, all the students were sent to their respective rooms.

It was indeed a long and tiring journey of around more than 10 hours, as usual by bus.

DAY= 4 (2.12.2022)



It was the most important day of the tour i.e visit to Supreme Court. After breakfast all the tour members left the house and proceeded to Supreme Court, after completing formality of securing of gate pass we enter the campus of Supreme Court, Being a law student this was the first proceeding which we had an opportunity to visit the supreme court, the guide who was provided gave very minute information about the construction and importance of the court, the visit came an end at 11:30 am.

In order to save the time, on that day we visited Lotus Temple and also people come to find peace and sanctity at this place of worship, before entering the Temple we have to take off our shoes and there are bags that are provided for our shoes. The Temple is a place of observation and peace so we have to remain silent when we enter. The Lotus Temple is open to people of all faiths, it is also known as the Bahai House of worship. The building comprises 27 Lotus petals arranged into groups of three, forming nine sides of direction. Nine doors on each side lead to the main hall inside. Lotus Temple is one of the remarkable architectures of Bahai faiths, the temple looks like a lotus flower and it is made of marble, cement, dolomite and sand.

All the students were happy to visit the temple, it was also a fantastic experience for students,

We are not spending much of time, after taking a photo and leaving the place, outside the temple we also did some shopping for souvenirs in street shopping, then we started the next visit by the same bus.

And the next visit to Qutab Minar at 2:00pm, got an opportunity to explore the Qutab Minar India's tallest historical monument. The whole area around the Qutab Minar is called the Qutab complex. It is one of the notable and prominent examples of Indo-Islamic architecture. The monument portrays the history of Delhi as it displays intricate carvings and verses from the Quran. The Qutab Minar is a towering 73 meter high tower built by Qutab ud din Aibak in 1193. This tower is the highest tower in India. Overall it was a unique experience. We were taken there to observe our rich heritage, and think about how it should be preserved. The tower



was made of marble and red sandstone. Its unique red colour represents the texture of the red sandstone used. The difference in colours is quite significant in its tower.

In a way, it was also a great learning experience for the students, we got to know more about the history behind the monument. A great visit which made us realise how

important heritage is. It was

a memorable experience and we gain a lot of knowledge, after the visit of Qutab Minar we also had lunch in one the Chinese restaurants outside the tower, obviously we enjoyed the food as well.

After the lunch all proceeded to visit Red Fort by the same bus, and our Bus journey was a lot of fun. We reach the venue at 5:00pm, the entrance of the fort is through the Lahori Gate. Near it is the Meena bazaar, the Red Fort is located in heart of Delhi. The Fort was the main home of the emperors of the Mughal dynasty for around 200 years until the 1857 unity. It was Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan who got it constructed in 1639.

We enjoyed the Mughal style of architecture with the fusion of Persian and Hindu Traditions, Each and every wall of the Fort was telling us the beautiful stories of Aristocracy and Indian Freedom Movement. After wandering a lot in the lush greenery of the fort we took photos as a group and individually. It was a great opportunity to enhance the knowledge on our rich Indian history, especially for History students, many beautiful gardens adorned the place. Really it was the pleasant experience. Besides, the visit enhanced our knowledge about this great historical place, and our rich culture and tradition, indeed. It was a fantastic experience for the student and was truly a memorable day.



The last place to visit stop for the day was India Gate at 6:30pm .it was very beautiful and nice place to visit, students had interest in history as well, as we all know India Gate official name Delhi memorial originally called **All India war memorial**, monumental sandstone arch in New Delhi dedicated to the troops of British India who died in Wars fought between 1914 and 1919.India gate



which is located at the eastern end of the Rajpath(formerly called the Kingsway),is about 138feet (42 metres) in height.

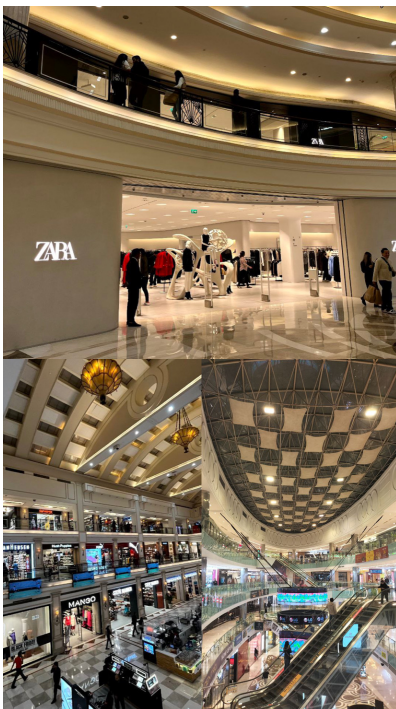
